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BANSWARA PARIYOJANA

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Mahi Bajaj Sagar Parikrama

The Banswara project has been working on a large scale in the education sector based on the involvement of local society with the basic mantra of education, culture, and self-reliance in the tribal dominated area of Rajasthan for many years. Along with this, many other programs have been organized as per the need including awakening on the topics of Indian culture, religious, environmental and national importance, including padyatras, festivals for the promotion of cultural and traditional heritage, organising visits to the major pilgrimages of the country.

Mahi Mata Parikrama: - The Mahi River is the second largest river in Rajasthan, and on this Mahi River, Mahi Bajaj Sagar remains the second largest dam in Rajasthan in Banswara, which is irrigating more than 1.00 lakh hectares of land, thereby The economic condition of the region has improved. The Mahi River is on the Beneshwar Dham with the two major rivers Som, and Jakham in the Triveni Sangam area. The entire Hindu society of this region considers the Mahi river as holy as Ganga Mata and the Beneshwar Dham as a pilgrimage place like the pilgrimage Prayagraj. Hindu society (also tribal society) surrenders here to its ancestors. For the protection of environment, our ancestors awakened the reverence for nature in the public by giving them the form of river and forests, this reverence is strengthened in the public, so that the last four years on the occasion of Ganga Dussehra, 125 of Mahi Bajaj Sagar A walk round of km (filler area of the dam) is organized, in which the saints, women, men and children of the area are also For a good rain Mahi praying mother (Mother Ganga). This year too, a five-day walk round of 125 km (filling area of Mahi dam) of Mahi Bajaj Sagar of local saints and villagers led by

Yatra at the Mahi Mata Temple, set on the banks of the Mahi River (on the Gemon bridge), ended with the Dharmasabha and Mahaprasadi. In the Dharmasabha, the society was motivated by the saints to protect the water sources (river, drains) forests as their gods.

- Parikrama - 8 to 12 June 2019
- Parikrama - 125 km (Almost)
- Parikrama passed through 29 villages.
- Night stay - in 4 villages.
- Participation - 3500 women, men and children from more than 60 villages (approx.)
- Kalash Yatra - More than 500 women of the tribal society in the Kalash Yatra.
- Dharmasabha: - 2000 (approx) women, male children in Dharmasabha.
- Arrangements: - Eating, drinking, living arrangements were made by the villagers.
- Program: - Worship of Mahi Mata (Mahi River), sermons of saints, hymns Resolution for environmental protection.
